Welcome to "Dancemoves 16", performed by the students of the Dance Studies Course at Inchicore College. This course has been in existence since 1994, and during this time has gone from strength to strength. The college provides a two-year full-time programme, offering students the chance to develop their dance technique and performance ability to a higher level. There is an additional one year programme that gives the students the opportunity to obtain and complete the international teaching qualifications. Graduates of the course are working and studying all over the world: from England, Holland and France, to as far away as New Zealand in such varied roles as teachers, dancers and choreographers.



Last summer, ten of our students had the opportunity to travel to Le Pacifique Choreographic Centre in Grenoble France for three weeks, where they took part in intensive workshops and worked under the mentorship of Jackie Simoncelli. Another ten students travelled to Vienna in Austria for three weeks, where they took part in the Impulz Tanz International Summer Dance Festival. All of his was made possible by funding from the Erasmus + Programme [changing lives opening minds].

As a result of this, the students developed their own work as part of the Inchicore College "Core Dance Company. The students have performed at Le Pacifique Choreographic Centre in France, The Irish Youth Festival in Dublin, Bel Fest and Heritage night in Belfast, the QQI launch at the AVIVA and the Largus Forum at Dublin Castle. They also performed at Dance Intervarsitie at Trinity College, the Link theatre in Belfast and the Dance Gala at the Lir theatre in Dublin. It has been a very productive and exciting year for our students.

Academically, we have had another fruitful year, with students entering the Diploma in Dance Instruction and the Diploma in Dance Education in both Modern Theatre Dance and Classical Ballet. Our students have also taken the Imperial Society of Dancing Vocational examinations and the Royal Academy of Dance Vocational examinations in recent months. Some of our students have also gone on to take the Royal Academy of Dance Certificate in Ballet Teaching Studies, as part of the Royal Academy of Dance Distance Learning Programme.

Last year several of our students were successful in attaining places at a number of internationally renowned colleges including Laban, Northern Ballet, Northern Contemporary, Morea Performing Arts and Fontys. We are incredible proud of them and wish them continued success.

Finally the Dance Studies Course would like to thank all the dance teachers who have supported us over the years. Without their support our success would not be possible. We hope you enjoy this evening's show.

Diane has studied with Gregory Hines, Josh Hilbermann and Savion Glover. She also trains regularly with Heather Cornell of Manhattan Tap. She was invited to teach as part of the International Tap Festival in Philadelphia. She is artistic director of Tapestry – a rhythm tap company unique to Ireland. Diane holds an MA in drama and performance studies, having graduated from UCD with First Class Honours. Diane has recently qualified [HONS] as a physical therapist and is a member of the Irish Association of Physical Therapist..

Adrienne Brown

PhD, M.A.(Hons), B.A. (Hons)

Adrienne Brown was born in Dublin, began her dance education with ballet classes and later at the London Contemporary Dance School, where she studied for three years. She founded New Balance Dance Company in 1987, with which she danced and choreographed for extensively. From 1991-1998 she attended the Martha Graham Center of Dance in New York, gaining first place in her teacher-training certificate in 1996 with A+.

She choreographed over 40 original works, which have been staged in Ireland, England and France. Her works draw on many stimuli: movement; narrative; text; musicality and compositional elements. She collaborated with several composers in her work, and has also worked with recorded music: Bach, Beethoven, Arvö Part, John Taverner and Ian Wilson. She takes inspiration from the writings of Oscar Wilde, W.B. Yeats, Paula Meehan, Charlotte Mew and Beth Ann Fennelly. Adrienne was a longstanding member and chair of Dance Ireland from 2008 – 2013.

Adrienne was the first Irish choreographer to be invited to take part in the inaugural "Righting Dance" project in 1997, at the Institute of Choreography and Dance, Cork. This was a mentored research project, which took place over three years under her chosen mentor, international choreographer Kim Brandstrup of ARC Dance. Following three years' research, the Institute commissioned her to create the full-length dance work Colmcille, which premiered in 2000 and toured Ireland in 2001.

From 2002-2005 Adrienne completed a B.A. degree in University College Dublin, graduating with honors in Music and English, thereafter a master's degree in American Studies. In 2006 she was awarded an Ad Astra Research Scholarship from U.C.D to undertake a PhD in Musicology, her topic being the analysis and interpretation of late twentieth-century music and dance. She graduated in 2012, her thesis "Meaning Indicators in Twentieth-Century Music and Dance" focusing on the work of choreographers Merce Cunningham and Mark Morris, along with composers J.S. Bach and Gavin Bryars. Adrienne collaborated with Eoghan O'Reilly to create 'I See His Blood', a dance film for the opening of Richmond Barracks on May 2nd 2016.

The film, shown at video screen dance festival in Bourgogne, France; f.a.d. Festival North Carolina where it won Best Cos-

tume and audience choice Best Film; will be shown in Kilcoole remembers 1916 and other festivals in Ireland and the U.S.

Melissa Harman

B.A Hons Theatre Dance, LISTD

Melissa was born in Hertfordshire, England. She trained at The Melanie-Jane Dance Accademy, North Hertfordshire College and The London Studio Centre on a full Scholarship.

Professional Theatre Credits include Dot/Assistant Choreographer in 'Honk' (Gordon Craig Theatre, Stevenage), Ensemble/Understudy Ali and Lisa in 'Mamma Mia' (Prince Edward Theatre, London), Ensemble/Dance Captain in 'The Wiz' (Pleasance Theatre, London and UK Tour), Rita Adams/Dance Captain in 'South Pacific' (UK Tour) as well as numerous Summer Seasons and Pantomimes.

Melissa moved to Dublin in 2004 where she started her teaching career at The Dublin School of Dance. She holds the ISTD Licenciate Diploma in Modern Theatre Dance and Imperial Ballet and is an Approved Tutor for the DDI and DDE qualifications in both genres. She also trained to teach Matt Mattox based Jazz Dance at The London Studio Centre. Melissa was Ballet Mistress for the Junior Associates of the Irish National Youth Ballet from 2005 until 2011 choreographing 'Alice in Wonderland', 'The Ugly Duckling' and 'The Nutcracker' for the Junior Company.

She has taught on the Dance Studies Course at Inchicore College since 2006 and also teaches at The Debbie Allen School of Dance in Dundrum, TheatreWorx Academy at The Helix theatre and her own school, Citywest Ballet Studio.

Mariam Ribon

Mariam Ribón, originally from Spain, moved to Dublin late 1995. In 2002 Mariam graduated with First Class Honors in her Master in Contemporary Dance Performance at UL. As a professional dancer she has worked with New Balance Dance Co., Daghdha Dance Co., MaNDaNCe, Cois Céim, Opera Ireland, Irish Modern Dance Theatre, Shakram Dance Company and Catherine Young Dance.

Mariam has been the Artistic Director of the Dublin Youth Dance Company (DYDC) and the Irish Youth Dance Festival since 2002. Mariam's choreographies have been seen in Ireland, UK, Czech Republic, Spain and USA.

Currently Mariam has been working on a variety of projects with her company DYDC including, "Home To Self", in association with the Dublin Simon Community and the National Film School in the Dun Laoghaire Institute of Art, Design and Technology and a collaboration with lense based artist Sharon Murphy and composer Michael Gallen on a visual arts project entitled 'Move On', both supported by The Arts Council and Dublin City Council.

She will also present DYDC at Dublin Dance Festival 2016's "Moveable Feast" in May.

In June she will be running an International Dance Residence at Dance House in collaboration with Dance Ireland and will present the 16th Irish Youth Dance Festival at the Pavilion Theatre in July.


